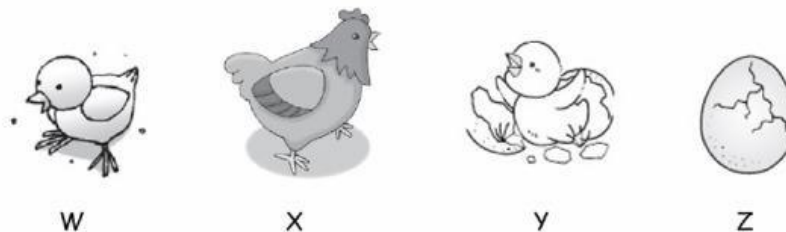

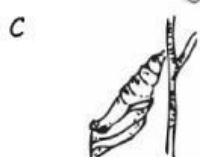

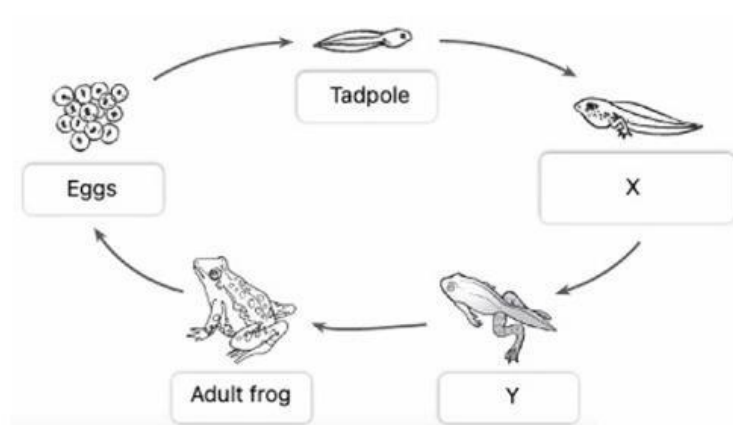
4. The following shows the life cycle of a butterfly.
