READING COMPREHENSION PASSAGE

A Day at the International Antique Market

My name is Arthur Pendelton, and I am sixty-eight years old. Today is Saturday, and I am at the grand international antique market in central London with my daughter, Beatrice. Beatrice is twenty-nine years old, and she is a high

school history teacher. We are looking for interesting old items, furniture, and books for our home and for her classroom.

The market is very busy today. There are ninety different stalls selling unique objects from around the world. First, we stop at a stall managed by a shop assistant named Marco. Marco is thirty-four years old, and he is from Rome, Italy. His address is 45 Cambridge Road, London. Marco has many old items on his counter. Beatrice points to a small vintage clock on the shelf behind Marco. "Excuse me, how much is that clock?" Beatrice asks. Marco smiles and answers, "That clock is seventy-five pounds." Beatrice thinks it is a little expensive, but Marco explains that it is ninety years old and comes from Germany.

Next to the clock, there are six silver spoons. They are fifteen pounds each. Beatrice decides to buy two silver spoons. She asks Marco, "Can I pay by credit card?" Marco says, "Yes, of course. Here is the card machine." The total price for the two spoons is thirty pounds. Beatrice gives her credit card to Marco, types her secret code, and receives a paper receipt. Marco says, "Thank you very much. Here is your card and your receipt."

Later, we walk to another stall near the main door. The stall owner is a woman named Sarah Chubb. Sarah is forty-two years old, and her email address is sarah.chubb90@abcmail.com. She sells old wooden chairs, tables, and books. I see a beautiful old armchair. I ask Sarah, "How much is this armchair?" Sarah answers, "This chair is forty-nine pounds. It is in very good condition." I think forty-nine pounds is a very reasonable price, so I decide to buy it. However, I do not want to pay by credit card. I have fifty pounds in cash in my wallet. I give the fifty-pound note to Sarah. Sarah accepts the note, gives me the armchair, and hands me one pound in change. She also gives me a paper receipt.

By twelve o'clock, Beatrice and I are very happy with our purchases. We have two silver spoons and one comfortable wooden armchair. We leave the market and walk to a small café on Oxford Street to drink hot tea.
