The Rise of Remote Work

In recent years, the way people work has changed dramatically. Due to improvements in technology and fast internet access, more employees than ever are working from home instead of traveling to a traditional office every day. This **trend** is often called "remote work" or "telecommuting."

For many workers, remote work offers clear advantages. The biggest benefit is saving time and money on the daily **commute**. Without the stress of **busy traffic** or crowded public transport, employees often report feeling happier and less tired. Additionally, working from home allows people to organize their **working hours** around family commitments, such as taking children to school.

However, remote work also brings a few challenges. Some employees find it difficult to separate their professional life from their personal life. When your living room is also your office, it can be hard to stop working at the end of the day. Furthermore, working alone for long periods can make people feel **isolated** and lonely.

To solve these problems, many companies are now choosing a **hybrid model**. In this setup, employees work in the office for two or three days a week and work from home for the rest of the time. Experts believe that hybrid work will become the most common way of working in the future because it balances flexibility with social interaction.

STAGE 1: PRE-READING FILL-IN-THE-GAPS KEY

STAGE 2: IELTS READING ANSWERS & EXPLANATIONS

1. Improvements in internet speed have made remote work more common. **TRUE**

"Due to improvements in technology and fast internet access, more employees than ever are working from home..."

Explanation: Fast internet access (improvement in speed) is explicitly given as a reason for more remote work.

2. Working from home helps people save money on transport. **TRUE**

"The biggest benefit is saving time and money on the daily commute."

Explanation: "Commute" refers to daily transport/travel to work.

3. Employees who work from home always work longer hours than office workers. **NOT GIVEN**

"When your living room is also your office, it can be hard to stop working at the end of the day."

Explanation: The text mentions it *can be hard to stop*, but does NOT state that home workers *always* work longer total hours.

4. Working alone at home can make some workers feel lonely. **TRUE**

"Furthermore, working alone for long periods can make people feel isolated and lonely."

Explanation: The text directly states that working alone can cause feelings of loneliness and isolation.

5. Most companies require employees to buy their own office equipment at home. **NOT GIVEN**

(No mention in text)

Explanation: Equipment purchasing or costs are never mentioned in the passage.

6. In a hybrid model, staff work from the office every day of the week. **FALSE**

"In this setup, employees work in the office for two or three days a week..."

Explanation: "Every day" directly contradicts "two or three days a week".

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
