

Apostrophe (')

Grammar

An apostrophe (') is a small punctuation mark used for two main reasons:

1. Contractions (Short Forms)

An apostrophe replaces missing letters.

Examples:

- I am happy. → **I'm** happy.
- Do not run. → **Don't** run.

2. Possession (Showing Ownership)

An apostrophe can show that something belongs to someone.

Singular Nouns - Add 's

- Tom's book
- Anna's bag

Plural Nouns (ending in s)

- The cats' food (+1 cat)
- My parents' house
