

Past Simple 1: Regular Verbs



- ★ We use the **past simple** to talk about what happened in the past.
- ★ We usually add **-d** or **-ed** to the base verb to make the past form.
- ★ We put **did not** before the base verb to make negative sentences.

Past Simple 2: Irregular Verbs



- ★ Some verbs change their forms irregularly in the **past simple**.
- ★ We put **did not** before the **base verb** to make negative sentences.

Positive		Negative		
Subject	Verb	Subject	Did + Not	Base Verb
I/We/You/They	ate.	I/We/You/They	did not (= didn't)	eat.
He/She/It		He/She/It
