The Lantern Festival is a very special festival in China and some other Asian countries. It usually happens in February or March, on the fifteenth day of the first lunar month. People celebrate the end of the Chinese New Year holiday with this festival.

During the Lantern Festival, people hang many colourful lanterns in the streets, parks and houses. The lanterns are red, yellow, pink and green. Some lanterns have beautiful pictures or Chinese characters on them. At night, the streets look very bright and beautiful because of the lights.
