

SENTENCE ADVERBS: THE MOVIE INDUSTRY

The Changing Movie Industry

Interestingly, filmmakers are also experimenting with new technologies. Artificial intelligence can potentially help with special effects, editing, and even script development. However, this development has created concerns about creativity and the future of human jobs in the industry. Frankly, technology should support filmmakers rather than replace them.

Overall, the future of cinema seems both exciting and uncertain. Undoubtedly, technology will continue to influence the industry; **fortunately**, however, audiences will probably continue to value creative stories and memorable performances.

GRAMMAR: SENTENCE ADVERBS

What are sentence adverbs?

Sentence adverbs modify or comment on a whole sentence, rather than only one verb or adjective. They often express the speaker's certainty, uncertainty, possibility, attitude, opinion, honesty, evaluation, or summary.

Position

Sentence adverbs can often appear:

1. At the beginning: Clearly, streaming has changed cinema.
2. In the middle: Streaming will probably continue to grow.
3. At the end — less common for some sentence adverbs: The industry will change again, probably.

A comma is usually used when the adverb comes at the beginning.

1. CERTAINTY

clearly – definitely – obviously – undoubtedly – unquestionably

These adverbs show that the speaker is very sure about something.

- Clearly, streaming platforms have changed cinema.
- Undoubtedly, technology will influence future films.
- The movie will definitely attract a large audience.

2. LESS CERTAINTY

apparently – seemingly – supposedly

These adverbs show that the speaker is not completely sure.

- Apparently, the studio is planning a sequel.

- Seemingly, audiences are becoming more interested in independent films.
- The actor is supposedly negotiating a new contract.

The information may come from other people or available evidence, but the speaker does not present it as a fact.

3. POSSIBILITY AND PROBABILITY

possibly – potentially – probably – perhaps – maybe

These adverbs express how likely something is.

- The film will probably be released next summer.
- Possibly, the studio will announce another sequel.
- AI could potentially reduce production costs.

Probably = quite likely. Possibly / potentially = possible, but less certain.

4. HONEST AND DIRECT OPINIONS

frankly – honestly – seriously

These adverbs show that the speaker is expressing an honest or direct opinion.

- Frankly, I think the movie was too long.
- Honestly, I expected the film to be better.
- Seriously, filmmakers need to consider their audiences.

5. SUMMARIZING OR GIVING THE MAIN IDEA

basically – essentially – fundamentally – mainly – overall

These adverbs introduce a general conclusion or summary.

- Overall, the movie was successful.
- Basically, streaming has changed the way people consume entertainment.
- Fundamentally, movies are still about telling stories.

6. EXPRESSING ATTITUDE OR EVALUATION

amazingly – surprisingly – not surprisingly – predictably – fortunately – unfortunately – interestingly

These adverbs show the speaker's reaction or attitude.

- Surprisingly, the low-budget movie became a huge success.
- Unfortunately, several cinemas have closed.
- Interestingly, independent films are becoming more popular.
- Fortunately, the director found another studio.
