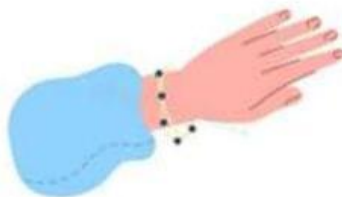

A Trip to Remember

Every year, Mrs Tan's class chooses a destination for their school trip, and the students always look forward to this occasion with great enthusiasm. This year, after a lively discussion, the students voted unanimously for the city museum, as they were curious to learn about how people lived a hundred years ago. The class traveled to the museum by train, which was an exhilarating experience for many students who had never taken a train before. As the train pulled out of the station, the children pressed their faces against the windows, eager not to miss a single sight along the way.

Upon arriving at the museum, a knowledgeable guide showed the students old photographs, handwritten letters, and even antique toys that children used to play with long ago. The students were astonished to discover that children in the past did not have phones or computers, yet they still found many ingenious ways to entertain themselves, such as inventing games with simple objects like sticks and stones. The guide explained that these humble objects, though ordinary in appearance, held great sentimental value for the families who once owned them. Several students admitted that they had never imagined life could be so different without modern technology, and a few even began to appreciate how fortunate they were.

Midway through the tour, the class paused in a quiet exhibition hall filled with faded black-and-white portraits. The guide spoke about the hardships people faced in the past, from long working hours to limited resources, yet also highlighted their resilience and creativity in overcoming these challenges. This part of the tour left a deep impression on many students, who began to reflect on how much comfort and convenience they enjoyed in their own daily lives.

After the tour, the students had a picnic lunch in the museum's tranquil garden, where they exchanged excited opinions about what they had just seen. Some students admitted that the trip was far more interesting than they had expected, because they could vividly imagine what daily life was really like before modern technology existed. Others said they felt a newfound sense of gratitude for the conveniences they often took for granted. Before boarding the train home, Mrs Tan gathered the class together and reminded them that even small, everyday objects





can tell us a big story about the past, and that history is not just found in textbooks, but in the ordinary things people leave behind.
