ADVERBS OF MANNER

ENGLISH GRAMMAR

 An adverb of manner is an adverb (such as strongly or slowly) that describes how and in what way the action of a verb is carried out.

FORMING ADVERBS FROM ADJECTIVES:

- In a large number of the cases, the adverb can be formed by simply adding '-ly' to the adjective.

ADJECTIVE	ADVERB
Cheap	Cheaply
Quick	Quickly
Strong	Strongly
- If the adjective ends in with 'y', replace the 'y' with an 'i' and add '-ly'.

ADJECTIVE	ADVERB
Ready	Readily
Merry	Merrily
Easy	Easily
- If the adjective ends with '-le', replace the 'e' at the end with 'y'.

ADJECTIVE	ADVERB
Understandable	Understandably
Forcible	Forcibly
Possible	Possibly
- If the adjective ends with '-ic', add '-ally'.
An exception: public -> publicly

ADJECTIVE	ADVERB
Idiotic	Idiotically
Tragic	Tragically
Basic	Basically
- Some adjectives do not change form at all.

ADJECTIVE	ADVERB
Fast	Fast
Straight	Straight
Hard	Hard
- In a large number of the cases, the adverb can be formed by simply adding '-ly' to the adjective.
