Trong tiếng Anh, từ "would" được sử dụng trong nhiều tình huống khác nhau như sau:

Radio Hits the Airwaves in Britain

In 1922, the British Broadcasting Company started its first daily news service in London. Although the idea of sending and receiving signals wirelessly via radio had been developed earlier, it was in 1922 that news, music, and talking segments filled the airwaves for a few hours each day. People who owned radio sets could tune in to get their daily dose of information and entertainment. Experimental television broadcasts didn't happen until 1929.

Tutankhamun's Discovery in Egypt

In November 1922, British archaeologist Howard Carter and his team made an exciting discovery in the Valley of the Kings, Egypt. They unearthed the burial chamber of young King Tutankhamun, who had been buried more than 3000 years ago. Thousands of priceless objects were retrieved, including the perfectly preserved mummy of 18-year-old Tutankhamun himself, enclosed in a solid gold coffin. The discovery captured the public's imagination, and newspapers and the emerging radio service reported every new find.

Wimbledon Finds a New Home

The first Wimbledon Tennis Championship took place in 1877, but it wasn't until 1884 that women were allowed to play. Over the following decades, tennis became increasingly popular. The original Wimbledon site, built on four acres of meadow in Wimbledon, London, soon became too small to host the event. The now-famous tennis tournament had to find a new home.
