THE RULES

Singular means **ONE** person, place, thing, or idea.

Plural means **MORE THAN ONE**.

Most nouns add **-s**.

book → books temple → temples

Nouns ending in **s, x, ch, or sh** usually add **-es**.

bus → buses dish → dishes
watch → watches

Nouns ending in **consonant + y** usually change **y** to **-ies**.

baby → babies city → cities
family → families

Some nouns change completely.

child → children person → people

For most nouns, singular = **one**.

For most nouns, plural = **more than one**.
