Reading: Planning the Study Trip

A group of university students is planning a study trip to London during the summer break. Their professor, Dr. Harris, has organized the trip because the students will visit several universities and important historical places.

Maria and her classmates are excited, but they have many decisions to make. First, they must choose their flights and book their accommodation. Dr. Harris says that they should make reservations early because prices may increase during the summer.

The students can stay in a university residence or in a small hotel. Maria thinks the residence is cheaper, but her friend Daniel says that a hotel would be more comfortable. They are still discussing their options.

Before travelling, the students must check their passports and other important documents. Some students may need a visa, depending on their nationality. They also should buy travel insurance because unexpected problems can happen during a trip.

Maria is worried about the weather. "It might rain while we are in London," she says. Daniel replies, "That's possible, but we can visit museums and indoor attractions if it rains."

During the trip, the students will attend a conference at a university. They could also meet international students and learn about different academic programs. Maria hopes they will have time to explore the city after the conference.

Finally, the group decides that everyone must arrive at the airport three hours before the flight. “We should be organized,” says Dr. Harris. “If we plan everything carefully, we will have an excellent academic and cultural experience.”
