	Rules	Example
Most words	+ ly	slow → slowly : She runs <u>slowly</u> . quiet → quietly : Ben speaks <u>quietly</u> .
Ending in -y	drop the -y + -ily	angry → angrily : Dad shouted <u>angrily</u> . happy → happily : The kids played <u>happily</u> .
Irregular	good → well fast → fast	good → well : She is a good singer. She sings <u>well</u> . fast → fast : Leo runs <u>fast</u> to catch the bus.
