- We use the present simple for things that are generally true or are habits.
- Contractions:** = do not, = does not.
- To make negatives we use *don't* / *doesn't* + verb ().
He doesn't . **NOT** ~~He doesn't works.~~

spelling rules for he / she / it

I work / play / live.
 I watch / finish / go / do.
 I study.

He / / .
 She / / / .
 She .

- The spelling rules for the *he / she / it* forms are the same as for regular plurals (see **Grammar Bank 2A** p.126).

Be careful with some *he / she / it* forms

I have he /hæz/ **NOT** ~~he have~~
 I go he /gəʊz/
 I do he /dʌz/

' you live in New York?' 'No, we .

' he work at night?' 'Yes, he .

- We use (or with *he, she, it*) + to make questions.
- The word order for present simple questions is **AS** = (do, does), (I, you, he, she, etc.), (work, live, etc.).

do and does

do = /dʊz/, does = /dʌz/

do and does can be:

- the auxiliary verb to make present simple questions.
 you speak English? she live here?
- a normal verb.

I my homework in the evening.
 He every day.
