Thirteen-year-old Dakota had been missing for three days in the sweltering July heat when a specialist arrived to help the poor boy. This was no ordinary rescuer; it was Scout a six-year-old bloodhound from the Farmington K-9 unit. For Scout tracking is a routine: he gets into his gear, relaxes for a moment, and then waits for a co-worker to present a scent. On this blazing afternoon, the stakes were incredibly high.

The ordeal began on Sunday, July 27, 2025. Dakota had set off across his grandmother's home in Goose Creek Lake, on his grey skateboard. Security cameras captured him skating past a firehouse around 9 a.m., wearing a Harry Potter T-shirt, and a ball cap. Dakota usually carried a school backpack when visiting his friend. However, on the tragic day, he was not carrying it. It was a route he took daily to visit his friend, Sam but Dakota never arrived.

When he failed to return by his usual 4 p.m. deadline, his grandmother became anxious. Since Dakota did not have his mobile phone, she contacted Sam, only to discover that Dakota had been missing all day. Panic soon set in for Dakota's mother, Stephanie, a corrections officer. While authorities initially suspected the teenager might have run away, Stephanie was certain something was wrong. Her son was a creature of habit, and disappearing without a call or text was completely out of character.

The search intensified. A team of nearly 50 volunteers, including Dakota's aunt Brittney—a volunteer firefighter—conducted a meticulous grid search. They utilized all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles, but the dense, wooded ravines of the 2,500-acre development proved difficult to navigate. As days passed, Stephanie struggled to remain *optimistic*, aware of the grim statistics regarding missing persons after 72 hours.

The breakthrough occurred on Wednesday morning. Dakota's brother, Steven, spotted a familiar purple skateboard lying in tall grass near a steep ravine. The board's position was chilling—the front end pointed down into a deep, rocky incline. Stephanie and her husband attempted to descend, but the terrain was treacherous and slick from recent rain. They could not find any footprints, which made them fear that something bad had happened.

The local sheriff's department realised their own K-9 units, primarily German shepherds, were not suited for a trail this cold. They requested Scout the bloodhound known for his ability to track older scents in thick vegetation. When Scout's handler, Lt. Joe Gillam, arrived, he offered no guarantees. Tracking a three-day-old scent was a challenge as it had become difficult to follow.

Within minutes, the dog signaled he had picked up a scent.

"He's got something!" one of the rescuers shouted.

Scout led the team down a 15-foot drop into the ravine. The rescuers followed him through thick oak trees and heavy undergrowth. Shortly into the search, they discovered Dakota's discarded T-shirt and trousers. Twenty-one minutes after starting, the radio crackled with a visual confirmation.

"I found him! He's alive!" a rescuer yelled.

Dakota was found lying in a shallow, temporary creek created by the rain. While the water had likely saved him from overheating in the July sun, he was severely dehydrated and unable to speak. A member of the K-9 unit carefully administered water drop by drop. Against all odds, Dakota was alive.

Digital payment is reshaping how students manage their daily expenses. Since smartphones are prohibited during school hours, cash cards have become an alternative to make payments in school.

These cash cards offer convenience and speed for daily transactions at school. Students can instantly pay for their recess meals by simply tapping their card against the electronic reader, which drastically reduces long canteen queues. 27 This seamless process saves precious break time, leaving more room for relaxation and socialising.

Furthermore, this cashless system provides excellent financial security features for worried families. Parents can easily top up funds via secure banking applications, which removes the danger of carrying large amounts of physical money. 28. This immediate action completely prevents any permanent loss or unauthorised usage of their valuable pocket money.

Digital card statements also promote open communication and financial transparency between parents and children. Every single transaction is automatically recorded in real time, allowing families to review their spending histories together. 29 Consequently, they can budget more effectively for upcoming academic projects or educational field trips.

However, electronic payments can encourage impulsive spending among younger consumers. Without physically handling paper notes and counting coins, students often fail to realise exactly how fast their money disappears. 30 As a result, they frequently end up wasting their limited allowance on unnecessary snacks or trendy items.

Conversely, traditional cash naturally teaches youth budgeting and financial awareness. Holding cash allows students to watch their money slowly decrease. 31 This visual cue naturally discourages careless impulse choices during the hectic school week.

Additionally, cash requires absolutely zero network connection, cellular data, or electricity, ensuring that students can always purchase essential food at any given time. 32 This means severe card reader malfunctions or unexpected power outages will never leave them hungry.

Ultimately mastering both digital and cash payments gives youth the financial skills they need for the real world. It makes them truly ready to manage their own money in the future.
