

Subject-Verb Agreement

	Rule	Example
Singular	<u>Single item</u> + <u>is / was / V-s(es)</u>	<u>A sweet apple</u> <u>is</u> on the table. <u>The boy</u> <u>runs</u> fast.
Plural	<u>Plural items</u> + <u>are / were / V</u>	<u>The shoes</u> <u>are</u> mine. <u>Those kids</u> <u>play</u> under the chair.
