What Is a Narrator?

A **narrator** is the voice or character who tells a story to the reader. The narrator may be a character in the story or someone outside the story.

Three Common Points of View

First Person: The narrator is a character in the story and uses words such as **I, me, my, we,** and **our**.

Example: I walked into the classroom and noticed that everyone was staring at me.

Second Person: The narrator speaks directly to the reader and uses words such as **you** and **your**.

Example: You walk into the classroom and notice that everyone is staring at you.

Third Person: The narrator is outside the story and refers to characters using **he, she, they,** or character names.

Example: Marcus walked into the classroom and noticed that everyone was staring at him.
