Air Pollution in Hanoi

Hanoi is facing serious air pollution problems. (1)_____ December 11, 2025, the city's air quality was very bad. The Air Quality Index reached 243, making Hanoi one of the most polluted cities in the world that day. Many people felt sick with eye problems and tiredness.

Vietnam's Anniversary Celebration

On April 30, 2025, Vietnam celebrated 50 years since the end of the Vietnam War. The biggest celebration was in Ho Chi Minh City. There was a large military parade with soldiers marching through the streets. Russian fighter jets and helicopters flew in the sky. Many people came to watch, waving red flags and singing songs about their country.
