

Reading text: *A School Trip to the UK*

Our class is planning a three-day school trip to the United Kingdom, and there are two possible destinations: London and Edinburgh.

London is the capital of England. The trip includes a guided tour of the Tower of London, free time for sightseeing near Big Ben, and a boat trip on the River Thames. Students will stay in a hotel close to the city centre, and the itinerary includes a day trip to Oxford by train. The flight from Alicante takes about two hours forty minutes, and the total price for three nights is 420 euros.

Edinburgh is the capital of Scotland. The trip includes a guided tour of Edinburgh Castle and a walk along the Royal Mile, with free time for sightseeing in the Old Town. Students will stay in a hostel a fifteen-minute walk from the centre. The flight from Alicante takes about three hours, with one stop, and the total price for three nights is 350 euros.

Both trips include breakfast, and the departure date for both is 14 May. Before the school confirms the booking, students must choose a destination.
