

PRIMER MOMENTO**First & Second Conditional****Topic: Holidays & Holiday Accommodation** First Conditional y Second Conditional☐ **1. First Conditional — Primer condicional**

Usamos el **First Conditional** para hablar de una situación **posible o probable en el futuro** y de su consecuencia.

La idea es:

Si ocurre esto, pasará esto.

Estructura

If + presente simple, will + verbo

If + present simple → will + base verb

Ejemplos

If I have enough money, I will go on holiday.

If the hotel is cheap, we will book it.

If the weather is good, we will go to the beach.

If the apartment has a kitchen, we will cook our own meals.

If the hotel is near the beach, we will walk there every day.

¿Por qué usamos First Conditional?

Porque estas situaciones son **posibles**.

Por ejemplo:

If the hotel is cheap, we will book it.

El hotel puede ser barato o no. Todavía no sabemos. Pero es una posibilidad real.

⚠ Regla importante

Después de **if**, usamos **present simple**, **NO will**.

✗ If the hotel will be cheap, we will book it.

✓ If the hotel is cheap, we will book it.

● 2. Second Conditional — Segundo condicional

Usamos el **Second Conditional** para hablar de situaciones **imaginarias, hipotéticas o poco probables** en el presente o futuro.

La idea es:

Si ocurriera esto, haría esto.

Estructura

If + past simple, would + verbo

If + past simple → would + base verb

Ejemplos

If I had more money, I would stay in a luxury hotel.

If I were in the Caribbean, I would swim every day.

If we travelled to Italy, we would rent a villa.

If I could choose any hotel, I would choose a beach resort.

If I had \$5,000, I would travel around Europe.

¿Por qué usamos Second Conditional?

Porque estamos **imaginando** una situación.

Por ejemplo:

If I had \$5,000, I would stay in a luxury resort.

La persona está imaginando que tiene \$5,000. No significa que realmente tenga ese dinero.

★ La diferencia más importante

Mira estos dos ejemplos:

First Conditional

If I have enough money, I will stay in a luxury hotel.

Significa:

Es posible que tenga suficiente dinero.

Estoy hablando de un **plan o posibilidad real**.

Second Conditional

If I had enough money, I would stay in a luxury hotel.

Significa:

Probablemente no tengo suficiente dinero, pero estoy imaginando la situación.

Estoy hablando de una situación **hipotética**.

Una forma fácil de recordarlo

	First Conditional	Second Conditional
Situación	Posible/real	Imaginaria/hipotética
Tiempo	Futuro	Presente/futuro hipotético
Después de if	Present	Past
Resultado	will	would
Ejemplo	If I have money, I will travel. If I had money, I would travel.	

Truco para los estudiantes:

FIRST = REAL POSSIBILITY

If + present → will

SECOND = IMAGINATION

If + past → would

Ejemplos comparando los dos

1. Hotel

If the hotel is cheap, we will book it.

Es una posibilidad real.

If the hotel were cheaper, we would book it.

Estoy imaginando que fuera más barato.

2. Holiday

If I have enough money, I will travel to Spain.

Quizás pueda viajar.

If I had more money, I would travel to Spain.

Estoy imaginando tener más dinero.

3. Accommodation

If we find a nice apartment, we will stay there.

Estamos buscando y podemos encontrarlo.

If we had a beach house, we would stay there every summer.

Estamos imaginando tener una casa en la playa.

Un detalle importante: were

Con el Second Conditional, especialmente con **I**, podemos usar **were**:

If I were rich, I would travel around the world.

If I were on holiday now, I would stay in a hotel near the beach.

Para estudiantes A2–B1, puedes enseñarles simplemente esta fórmula:

If I were..., I would...

Es una estructura muy frecuente y útil.
