There are so few _____ left, so others will have to carry the torch to tell and tell, again and again.</p> <p>Ariana Neumann writes so eloquently of her father's past, a hidden past too _____ for him to relive, to talk about, but eventually revealed. She writes of her family, many of whom perished at the hands of the Nazis and of those who survived. She _____ about how as a little girl growing up in Venezuela, she finds a photograph of her father in a box, an identity card with his picture and a stamp of Hitler. While this was the beginning of her _____ that her father had kept his past from her, it wasn't until many years later when at his death, he leaves her a box of letters and photos, that she realized that there was so much more to know . There was everything to know about her father and his family who suffered at the hand of the Nazis in their homeland in Czechoslovakia before he came to Venezuela. It was several years later that she was able to bring herself to have the letters translated and years before she could bring herself to read them the _____ he had begun writing . She generously shares them with us.</p> <p>She begins her journey to that past, reaching out to cousins and family friends, piecing together what they knew, tracing the lives of her grandparents in Terezin, piecing together her father's story. Neumann travels to the places where her father did, looking for remnants of her grandparents' lives, for the man who helped save her father. It's gut-wrenching as all Holocaust stories are, but it's filled with love for her father, filled with the love within the family she never knew. In her heartfelt _____, Ariana Neumann says "This book is dedicated to the memory of those who could not tell their stories. " We must keep reading the stories that others tell of them.
