Verbos regulares - To arrive **arrived** arrived

Verbos irregulares - To go **went** gone

Mary **went** to school yesterday. She **arrived** late.

Interrogativa: **Did** Mary **go** to school yesterday? **Did** she **arrive** late?

Negativa: Mary **didn't** **go** to school yesterday. She **didn't** **arrive** late.

Em inglês, a **forma interrogativa e negativa** dos verbos

(excepto o verbo TO BE e os "Modal verbs" (can, will, shall, must, may))

precisam do **auxiliar TO DO** no Past simple – To do **did** done –
seguido do **verbo principal no infinitivo**

+ **Verbo principal no infinitivo**

Na negativa

Sujeito

+ **did**

+ **NOT**

+ **Verbo principal no infinitivo**
