

Eggciting Easter



It is a famous egg game with simple rules: roll your egg down a hill, and if it gets at the bottom of the hill first and in one piece you are the winner. Every year this game takes place on the lawn of the White House.

Easter is almost here and many children look forward to a visit from the Easter Bunny. There are a lot of different egg games. Read the description of a few games and match them to their names. Have a great time at Easter!



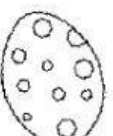
Contestants stand in a circle and take it in turns to throw an egg in the air. The winner is the one who throws the egg highest and catches it again.



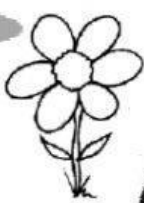
The competitors must balance an egg in a spoon and run to the finish line without dropping the egg. If the egg drops but is not broken, the competitor can pick up the egg while standing still. The winner is the person who gets to the finish line first.



This race uses eggs with their insides blown out! Place these lightweight eggs on a flat surface like a table or plywood. Give each contestant a straw. Contestants must race their egg to a finish line at the other end of the table using nothing but air through the straw. More difficult than it sounds!



Somebody hides the eggs in the garden and the children have to find them, and put them in their baskets. The winner is the one with the most eggs.



Place one egg in the centre of a large circle. The players stand outside the circle each with an egg. Everyone takes turns rolling their egg towards the egg in the circle. The aim is to get as close to the centre egg as possible without touching it. If you touch it or break your egg you are out!
