• We use will / won't + infinitive for making instant decisions, offers, and promises. We don't use the present tense.

I'll help you with those bags.

NOT I help you with those bags.

• When an offer is a question, we use Shall I...? or Shall we...? Shall I pay? Shall we do the washing-up?
