



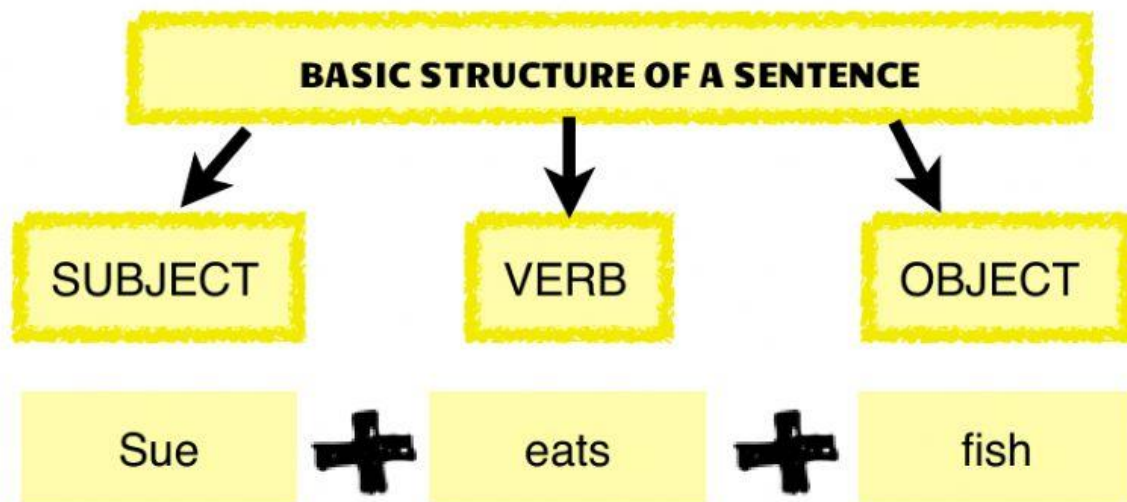

Present Participles

Verb



ing

It describes an action in progress

E.g The children are **playing** in the playground.

It can be used to describe an action being done in the present or the past.

E.g They were **studying** in the classroom when the earthquake happened.

Beginning a sentence with a present participle means putting the focus on the **ACTION** instead of the **PERSON** performing the action !



Regular sentence



Darla picked seashells as she walked on the beach.

The focus is on the **PERSON**

Sentences beginning with a PRESENT PARTICIPLE.



Walking on the beach, Darla picked seashells.

The focus is on the **ACTION**
which is **walking on the beach**.

Emotions

Beginning a sentence with an emotion means putting the focus on the **EMOTION** instead of the **PERSON** or the **ACTION** !



Regular sentence



Jane stomped out of the room because she was furious.

The focus is on the **PERSON**

Sentences beginning with an EMOTION.



Furious, Jane stomped out of the room.

The focus is on the **EMOTION** which is the word, **furious**.
