After the American Civil War (1861-65), (0) slavery ended forever. (1), in the south of the United States, Afro-Americans did not have the same (2) and opportunities as white people. This was a terrible (3) and Martin Luther King decided to solve it.

Dr. Martin Luther King was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia, a southern state. He was an excellent (4) and became a Baptist Minister¹. At that time there was segregation in the South. This meant that Afro-Americans could not use certain kinds of (5) They could not go to the (6) schools and churches as white people.

Dr King disagreed with this and he protested (7) against segregation in the cities and towns of the South. In August 1963 Dr. King organized a huge demonstration called the Civil Rights March in Washington D.C. More than 200,000 (8) joined him! On that occasion he gave his famous (9) , "I have a dream".

These are some lines from that speech:

"I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. I have a dream today."

In 1964 America passed the Civil Rights Act, which changed and improved the (10) of millions of Afro-Americans. Segregation became illegal in schools, churches and other public (11)

Dr. King won the Nobel Peace Prize in the same year.

Some Americans did not agree with the Civil Rights Act. On April 4, 1968 James Earl Ray killed Dr. King in Memphis, Tennessee; this was a tragic day for America. The third Monday in January is a national (12) in the United States, when Americans celebrate Martin Luther King Day in (13) of this great American hero.
