___ Dorian wishes he could stay young and good-looking for ever while his portrait grows old. This is, in fact, what happens during his life.

___ The servant finds Dorian Gray dead on the floor, with an old, ugly face, while the portrait of the young and beautiful Dorian hangs untouched on the wall.

___ One day Basil meets Dorian and asks about stories he has heard of Dorian's immoral life. Dorian tells him the secret of the portrait, shows it to him, then stabs him to death. He blackmails a former friend who is a scientist and who reluctantly agrees to destroy the body.
