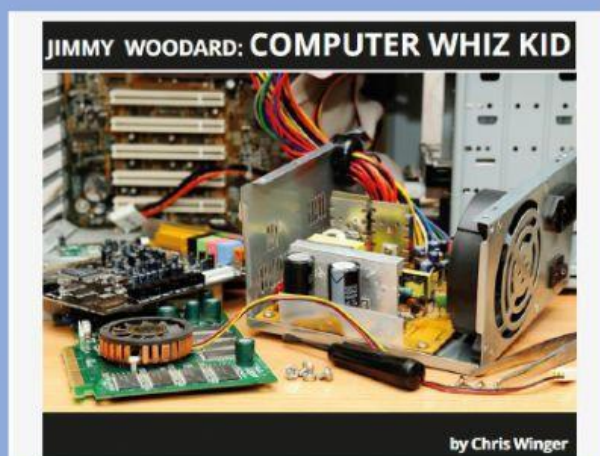

17had a problem with the computer, he figured out how to fix it by himself! When Jimmy
18was in fifth grade, his technology teacher gave him a computer to work on. Jimmy
19took the computer apart and put it back together again. Since then, Jimmy has been
20working with computers in his school, even helping teachers with their technology
21problems. When he was fourteen, Jimmy decided to open his own technology
22consulting company. Since that time, he's brought in about 200 regular customers.
23One of them is former astronaut Gerald Carr. "It feels funny sometimes," said Jimmy
24with a smile. "I can't believe I'm helping an astronaut with his computer!" Jimmy has
25done more than just work on computers. Since he was eleven or twelve, Jimmy has
26been helping and working in his community. He's managed the sound and lights for a
27local TV show and for theatrical performances. Jimmy has also worked as a DJ. "I've
28been a DJ at more than fifty dance events already," he said. "It's really fun." Jimmy has
29saved a lot of money over the past three years. "I've just bought my own car," he said
30happily. "I've used some of my money to buy more computers or equipment for my
31company. But I'm trying to save the rest of it for college." As for his future, Jimmy
32explained, "I don't know what I want to do yet. I know I want to do something with
33computers. But I'm interested in a lot of different things. I'd like to live in a big city
34someday. I can't wait to see what happens next."
