

TAG QUESTIONS

Use them at the end of a sentence to ask for confirmation.

For positive statements we usually use negative tag questions (e.g., The cat eats fish, doesn't it?).

For negative statements we usually use positive tag questions (e.g. We aren't late, are we?).

Drag the options.

Maria <u>eats</u> chocolate,	didn't he?
Peter <u>ran</u> five kilometres,	doesn't he?
We <u>will go</u> to the cinema,	isn't it?
The dog <u>is sleeping</u> ,	didn't they?
My parents <u>are</u> tired,	can we?
Janet <u>'s done</u> her work,	don't you?
You <u>couldn't hear</u> the concert,	does he?
The kids <u>can ride</u> a bike,	was he?
Carlos and Leslie <u>ate</u> a cookie,	could you?
James <u>doesn't drink</u> coffee,	did you?
You <u>love</u> pizza,	can't they?
Anthony <u>plays</u> football,	hasn't she?
You <u>didn't read</u> the book,	aren't they?
We <u>can't drive</u> ,	doesn't she?
Mario <u>wasn't</u> sad,	won't we?
