READ THE TEXT AND ANSWER THE QUESTIONS BELOW:

Carla says that it was love at first sight between her and the former French President Nicolas. She said that what happened between Nicolas and her was not quick, it was instant. And the very first time in my life I ever felt passionately was the moment I saw him. It was a feeling so loving, so tender, so wild, so overwhelming and breathtaking, and all-involving, a feeling I did not know before."

Love at first sight is not easy to explain. Some people that is just merely attraction, because how can we fall profoundly in love after one quick glance? How can such a glance make us believe that we want to spend the rest of our life in the arms of a stranger we have just seen for the first time?

Arguments against the possibility of love at first sight are usually based on two main reasons. The first reason claims that as we don't have sufficient knowledge about the person's characteristics in order to fall in love, our response is imaginary, wishful thinking and not a real emotion. The second reason refers to the fact that as we don't have the time to exercise the activities typical of love, our emotional response can't be of romantic love.

The first argument implies that romantic love consists not merely of attraction to external appearance, which is the basis of desire, but also of knowing the person's character, such as kindness, honesty, wisdom and a sense of humour. Such knowledge can't be present at first sight, as it requires familiarity.

The fact that love at first sight may be based on unreliable information does not mean that it is not an instance of intense love. Research indicates that romantic love is often based on idealization and positive illusions, and this is also true concerning love that lasts many years. This is also the case concerning other emotions. For instance, jealousy is often based on incorrect beliefs about the partner's activities.
