APPENDIX

A. LANGUAGE FACT: PRESENT PERFECT TENSE:**When to use "Present Perfect Tense"?**

We use the Present Perfect Tense to talk about experiences. It is important if we have done it in our lives or not. It is not important when we did it.

Examples:

- I **have been** abroad two times.
- Anna **has never broken** a leg.
- **Have** you **ever eaten** sushi?

Tip:

We often use **NEVER** and **EVER** with the "Present Perfect Tense" to talk about experience.

Structure:

- (+) Subject + **have/has** + **verb (participle)** + complement.
- (-) Subject + **have/has** + **not** + **verb (participle)** + complement.
Subject + **have/has** + **never** + **verb (participle)** + complement.
- (?) **Have/has** + Subject + **verb (participle)** + complement + ?
Have/has + Subject + **ever** + **verb (participle)** + complement + ?
