Adjectives with one syllable, add: '-er' or '-r' + 'than'	<p><b>cold</b></p> <p>"In Canada, winter is <u>colder</u> <u>than</u> summer."</p>	Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'more' + 'than'	<p><b>ex-pen-sive</b></p> <p>"This book is <u>more expensive</u> <u>than</u> that book."</p>
Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: '-er' + 'than'	<p><b>hap-py</b></p> <p>"John is <u>happier</u> <u>than</u> David."</p>	Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'than'	<p><b>big</b></p> <p>"Russia is <u>bigger</u> <u>than</u> Canada."</p>
