In the distance rise the craggy _____ of Snowdonia and _____ below you are the harbour and narrow streets of Conwy – still protected by an unbroken 1,400-yard (1.3km) ring of town walls.

It's enough to take the _____ away. Especially when you consider that King Edward I and his architect Master James of St George built both castle and walls in a _____ believable four years between 1283 and 1287.

Conwy takes its place _____ Edward's other great castles at Beaumaris, Harlech and Caernarfon as a World Heritage Site.



This famous fortress is exceptionally well _____. It contains the most intact set of medieval royal apartments in Wales. The high curtain wall and eight lofty towers rise almost as _____ as when they were built more than 700 years ago.
