- Avoid driving alone, especially at night, and **NEVER** pick up strangers or hitch-hikers.
- 15 Keep your parents, the police and your family doctor's numbers stored in your phone for emergency purposes.
- Always keep in the car a first aid kit stocked with necessary supplies.
- Never throw trash from the car.
- Do not place anything over your licence plate that may hide the numbers.
- 20 Be courteous to other drivers.
- As much as possible, avoid 'road rage'.

Finally, plan to always drive defensively. Remember, driving is serious business. A car is not a toy; nor is it a weapon. The wheel will be in your hand. Be wise: drive to arrive alive.
