This is what some poor fishermen in the Philippines do to earn money. A recent

TV documentary filmed a group of fishermen and showed the dangers they face.



There are fewer fish in the sea these days because of overfishing, so some poor fishermen practise a fishing technique called paaling fishing. A group of men dive together from a boat and they attach a big net to the bottom of the sea with rocks. Then they wait for fish. They chase the fish into the huge net, close the net and bring it back up to the surface. The men have to stay underwater for a long time. They breathe air through special tubes which are connected to an engine on the boat.

The film shows a day's fishing and we see that the boat's engine is old, noisy and unreliable, and yet it is the lifeline for all these men. Twenty or more men have tubes that are connected to the same machine. As the men swim about underwater the tubes get mixed up and twist about until they look like spaghetti. One cause of death is when a tube breaks and the fisherman can't breathe. Another serious danger is when the men stay underwater for a long time. If they come up too quickly, they get air bubbles in their blood which can cause serious health problems. One old fisherman told the film-makers about a relative who came up too quickly. The man is now paralysed - he cannot move. And he will never get better.

It is clearly a very dangerous way of earning money. However, these fishermen have no choice. They say it is the only way to catch fish now. And they are too poor to buy safer equipment. There are many dangerous jobs in the world - but this must be one of the worst. Would you try it?
