Present Continuous Tense

Affirmative

Interrogative

Negative

I	am	working swimming
he she it	is	
we you they	are	

Am	I	working? swimming?
Is	he she it	
Are	we you they	

I'm	not	working swimming
he she it	isn't	
we you they	aren't	

SPELLING RULES

We add **-ing** to the main verb: work + ing = working

Exceptions

a. If the main verb ends in **consonant + stressed vowel + consonant**, we double the last letter: stop + p + ing = **stopping** / cut + t + ing = **cutting**

b. If the main verb ends in **ie**, we change the **ie** to **y**: die = **dye** + ing = **dying**

c. If the main verb ends in **vowel + consonant + e**, omit the **e**: come + ing = coming

USE

We use the present continuous tense to talk about:

- an action happening exactly now
- an action happening around now
