

Adverbs That Tell When or Where

RULES An adverb is a word that tells more about a verb.

Some adverbs tell when or where an action takes place.

The science fair begins tomorrow. (when)

The science fair takes place outside. (where)

You have learned that some adverbs tell how. Other adverbs tell when or where.
