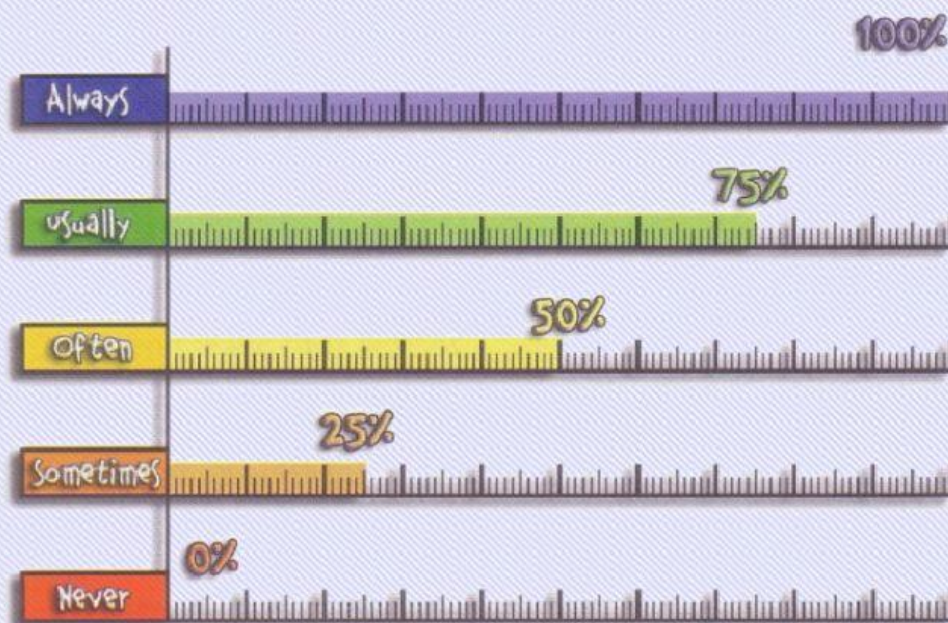


Always, Usually, Often, Sometimes, Never

- We use frequency adverbs to describe how often something happens. We use them with the Present Simple tense.



- We place the frequency adverbs **BEFORE** the main verb (in Present Simple).

*I **always** walk to work.*

*He **doesn't** usually wear jeans.*

***Do** you often write letters?*

- BUT**, we put them **AFTER** the verb **TO BE**.

*He **is** never late.*

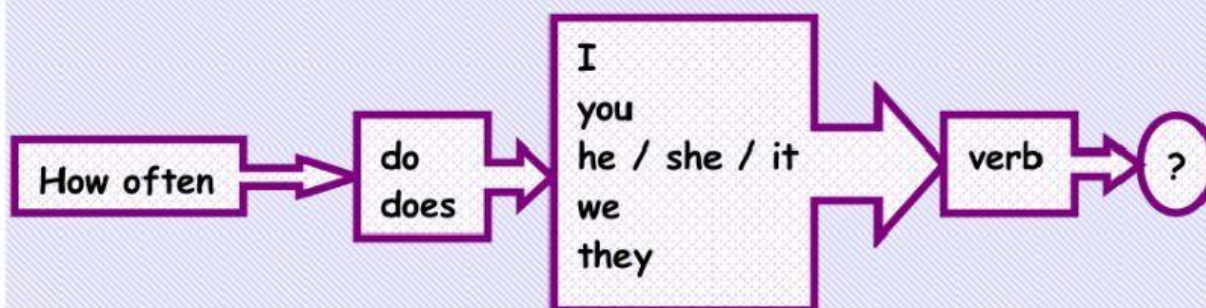
*The children **aren't** usually tired after school.*

***Are** you often sad?*

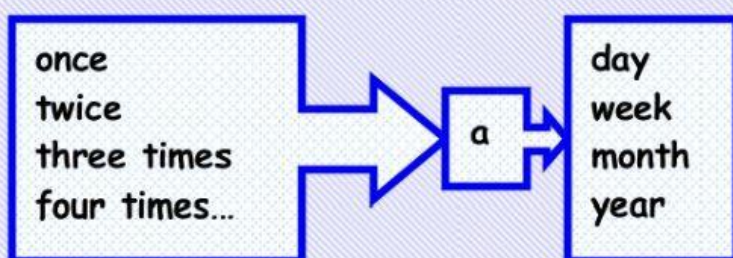


OTHER EXPRESSIONS OF FREQUENCY

How often...? → To ask about the frequency of an action.
We place it at the beginning of the question.



How often do you go to the cinema?
How often does Mary cook?



*We go to the theatre **once a week**.*
*Peter plays football **five times a month**.*



*Mary cooks **every day**.*
*I play tennis **every Sunday**.*

are placed at the end of the sentence
