When looking up German nouns in a dictionary, you'll find one of these three articles listed before a noun: *der*, *die*, or *das*. In English there is only one definite article "the." These three German articles are also referred to as masculine (*der*), feminine (*die*), and neuter (*das*), abbreviated "m" for "masculine," "f" for "feminine," and "n" for "neuter" in dictionaries.
