



CORAL REEFS IN THE BAHAMAS



Our coral reefs are among the world's most beautiful. They are an important natural resource. A coral reef is a living community of many tiny organisms called **polyps**. Reefs form in warm, clear sea water. Because coral needs sunlight, reefs are only found in shallow waters.

A reef is a very special environment, which provides shelter, feeding and breeding grounds for many fish and marine plants and animals. Reefs also help to protect beaches and coasts from erosion by waves. But a reef is a very delicate environment that is easily destroyed by even a small change in conditions. A coral reef is built up over many hundreds of years. But in just a few days or months, people can destroy a coral reef forever.
