Art Made of . . . Cheese?

Artists are always looking for new and interesting ways to express themselves in their art. Sometimes they choose to use interesting materials. Sculptor Sarah Kaufmann is a good example. She carves her sculptures out of cheese!

Kaufmann is inspired by cheese. She says that she chooses this material for her sculptures because it's part of her background. She is from the state of Wisconsin, where many kinds of cheeses are made. She usually carves hard cheese, like cheddar.

Sarah uses knives to carve the cheese. She works by slowly cutting away the cheese to create her sculptures. She says
