When we multiply by 10 the digits in a number move 1 place to the left

Short cut for decimal numbers – move the decimal one place to the right

$$36 \times 10 = 360$$

36×10 **Short cut for whole numbers** – add two zeros

When we multiply by 100, the digits move 2 places to the left.
