Read the text and answer the questions.

Wyclef Jran was born in Haiti, a poor island in the Caribbean, in 1972. When he was nine years old, his family moved to the USA. He grew up in New Jersey where he met Pras Miche, another Haitian, and Lauren Hill, an African-American. Together, they formed a band in the mid 1990s. They called their band The Fugees, a short form of the word "refugees", because all of their families had come to the USA to look for a better life. As well as being a successful musician, Wyclef spent a lot of time giving humanitarian help to his homeland.

Most of this aid has come through the Yele Haiti Foundation, which he created in 2004 with his cousin. Yele means "a cry for freedom" and Yele Haiti aims to help people in Haiti with small projects that can provide them with work, food and somewhere to live. Wyclef wants Haitians to be able to live in their own country and not to have to become refugees to survive.

Wyclef has had a lot of support for his foundation from other show-business stars. Brad Pitt and Angelina Jolie attended the first anniversary party for Yele Haiti. After Hurricane Ike hit the island in 2008, Matt Damon went to Haiti to serve food to the people who had lost their homes in the storm. Wyclef's story shows that people who leave their own country can sometimes give something back to help the people who are left behind.
