## ADJECTIVES WITH -ED AND -ING

AN ADJECTIVE is a word that tells us more about a noun. EXAMPLE: Bobby has a young son.

	Adjectives with -ed	Adjectives with -ing
Use to	Describe someone's feelings	Describe someone or something that causes a feeling.
Example	I am confused.	The recipe is confusing.
Note	We often use adjectives with -ing with It's, That's, and How.
