

## Avoiding Double Negatives

A negative is a word that means "no" or "not." Some common negatives are **no, no one, not, none, never, nothing, nowhere, and nobody**. Contractions formed with not are also negatives.

Two negatives used in the same sentence are called a double negative. **Double negatives** should be avoided because they make the meaning of a sentence unclear.

**Wrong:** Motorcars won't never work well! **Right:** Motorcars will never work well!

**Right:** Motorcars won't ever work well!

Notice that a double negative can be corrected in different ways. In the second and third sentences above, an affirmative, or "yes" word, has been substituted for one of the negatives. This chart shows the affirmatives for other words.

Negative	Affirmative	Negative	Affirmative
no	any, a, one, some	nothing	anything, something
no one	anyone, someone	nowhere	anywhere, somewhere
none	all, some	nobody	anybody, somebody

**Summary** \* Some negative words, such as not, are adverbs. Avoid using two negative words in the same sentence.
