Do you know how much do your parents spend in food a month?


Is your favorite food expensive \$\$\$\$ or cheap \$?


For example: 1 carton of milk: 80\$, they buy 5 cartons a month = 5 times 80\$= 400\$

The total amount you can spend on something is called budget. Budget in Spanish is *presupuesto*.


