We use the present perfect to talk about things in the past, when we don't say exactly when they happened.
affirmative
I've read about England in books. He / She / It's had lessons at home. You / We / They've lived all their life in the USA.
negative
I haven't visited a big city. He / She / It hasn't used a computer. You / We / They haven't travelled by plane.
