

Base word- A base word can stand alone and has a meaning.

Affixes- attachments added to a base word. Prefixes and suffixes fall into this category.

Prefix- a word part added to the beginning of a word

Suffix- a word part added to the end of a word

Root- the basis of a new word, but it does not typically form a stand-alone word on its own. Most English words come from Latin or Greek roots.

For example, the word *reject* is made up of the prefix *re-* and the Latin root *ject*, which is not a stand-alone word.

Common prefixes are: "tri"- three, "de"- down or opposite, "in"- not, "dia"-through, across or entirely. "Man"-with hands, "audi"- to hear, "trans"-across or beyond, "cent"-hundred, "dec"-ten, "dis"-apart, in a different direction or away. "Dis"- lack of

Common Suffixes are: "ful"- full of "volve"- to turn around or roll "solve" "ment"-result of an action "ness"- quality or state of "ive"-pertaining to or tending to.
