Pat: No, I'm **not**.

Emily: **Are** you taking the photos again ?

Pat: No, I'm with a broken arm

To make questions we place the verb before the subject. Para hacer preguntas colocamos el verbo delante del sujeto.

Is	+	the boy on the bike	+	Eliot?
Veb to be	+	subject	+	complement?

Short
Answers

We usually answer these questions using **short answers:**

Yes + subject pronoun + auxiliary verb.

No + subject pronoun + auxiliary verb.
