Simple Present. – Affirmative and Negative–

Read and listen to the story and correct the sentences. Follow the example. Do not use short (contracted) forms.

0) Harry Black looks at a watch. (pgs. 1-2)

Harry Black **does not look** at the watch. **He** looks at a painting.

1) Harry takes the painting very quickly. (pg. 2)

2) A blue glass vase falls on the table. (pg. 3)

3) Harry runs across the pieces of glass to the door. (pg. 3)

4) Mrs. Allen and Janey hear Harry's steps. (pg. 4)

5) Janey thinks recycling is boring. (pg. 5)

6) Recycling trucks come on Thursdays. (pg. 6)

7) Harry sends an e-mail to a man in Seattle. (pg. 7)

8) Janey takes the newspaper from under Harry's night table. (pg. 8)

9) Janey puts the old newspapers into a green recycling box. (pg. 9)

10) Harry looks for his million-dollar vase in the truck. (pgs. 10 / 11)

11) The men from the recycling truck watch Janey in the truck. (pg. 11)

12) Janey sees some blue glass in Harry's bed. (pg. 12) *

13) The policemen look at Harry's bed. (pg. 14)

14) The policemen find the blue glass vase in the truck. (pg. 15)

15) Janey gets a picture for helping the police. (pg. 15)
